

Wellness Matters - A regular health column from the Kurow Medical/Mackenzie Health Centre Team - October 2023

Daylight savings is upon us and how lovely to be able to enjoy longer days and warmer temperatures (apart from a few snowy blasts)!

Breast Cancer Awareness

October is breast cancer awareness month. Each day 9 Kiwi women of all ages are diagnosed with breast cancer. That's 3,500 women a year and 25 men too. Early detection with regular mammograms can save lives and women aged 45-69 years can have a free mammogram every two years. You can self-enrol BreastScreen Aotearoa by calling 0800 270 200 or registering online.

Screening recommendations for women outside of this age group vary and your healthcare provider can support you with more information or visit <u>www.timetoscreen.nz</u>

Self-examination is encouraged for all women from age 20 and is an important part of breast health awareness. Any changes like lumps, thickening, dimpling or nipple discharge should be reported to your healthcare provider.

Shingles (Herpes Zoster)

Many of us had chickenpox as a child, although there is now a vaccine for chickenpox which is delivered to children on the immunisation schedule at 15 months, and to some high-risk individuals or their close contacts. Shingles is caused by a virus called varicella zoster, which is the same virus that causes chickenpox.

Following chickenpox infection, the virus lies dormant in the nerves near the spine and can re-emerge later in life. Increasing age, some medications, certain medical conditions as well as emotional stress can cause the immune system to weaken which gives the virus an opportunity to reactivate as shingles. Symptoms of shingles usually start as a tingling or burning pain for two to three days and then a painful rash on one side of the body. This can be very debilitating and often lead to longer term complications.

People with these symptoms should seek advice and care as soon as possible. Clinicians can prescribe medication which is best started before the rash appears. This has been proven to reduce the duration and severity of shingles.

There is some good news on the shingles front however. A vaccine to prevent shingles is available and is free for anyone who is 65 years old (not older) and for some people with immunity problems. It is also recommended for other people aged 50 and over and a charge will apply. Find out more about vaccines at www.immune.org.nz.

Sun Smart

New Zealand sunlight can have high levels of ultraviolet (UV) radiation which can cause skin and eye damage and cancer. Our ozone layer is one of the thinnest in the world and UV index level three is enough to cause skin damage. Although it doesn't feel like it now, being sun smart all year round is important and more so heading into the warmer months. NIWA has a UV index app you can access at <u>www.niwa.co.nz</u> which gives localised reports.

So, until next time, stay well and cover up, slip into the shade, slop on sunscreen, slap on a hat and wrap on your sunnies – even on the cloudy days as 80% of UV radiation can get through the clouds.

The Early Years

In 1966 Thea Chapman held the first sessions of the Kurow Pre-School in her home as she was a former kindergarten teacher and saw the need for something for the pre-schoolers of the district. As the numbers grew larger the pre-school sessions were moved to the Buffalo Hall (now the Kurow museum and information centre. In the early years parents were very much hands on in the running of the pre-school.

In 1968 the Domain Board offered the committee the lease of the old schoolhouse should this property be vested in them by the domain board. It had previously been used as a teachers hostel but was no longer required. This offer was accepted at a meeting on the 2nd of July.

The president (Mrs Chapman) and secretary (Mrs Moyle) then met with the commissioner of lands while he was in Kurow for the opening of the sports grounds to discuss the leasing of the old schoolhouse.

Miss Fisher and Mr Mettrick from Child Welfare visited the schoolhouse. A plan of the house as it would be when renovations were finished was to be submitted to Child Welfare for approval as soon as possible.

It was discussed if the centre should become a Playcentre and the president of Playcentre in Dunedin was asked to come to see the centre in operation and to see what the differences would be. It was later decided that the pre-school would not become a Playcentre.

A major fundraising drive was commenced. Some of the events included:

- •A barn dance in the Otiake hall with country and western singer and television star Brendan Duggan as a guest and local band Van Rebeck playing.
- •Cane classes
- •Chocolate wheel at the gymkhana
- •Grocery raffles all mothers asked to contribute items
- •Toy making evenings to make toys for the pre-school with surplus sold.
- •Further raffles with donated prizes.
- •Keep Fit classes
- •\$1 to \$10 mothers were given \$1 to buy materials to make something that would sell for \$10.00 or as much as possible.
- •Fashion Parade
- Golf Tournament

At a meeting on the 29th of April 1969, it was discussed that confirmation had been received from the domain board on the lease of the old schoolhouse. Lex Wilson and Rowan Breen were to be conveners of the father's working bees. The alterations to the building were carried out with much voluntary labour and donated materials to keep costs down.

The pre-school moved into the new building at the beginning of 1970 and the official opening by Mrs Allan Dick, wife of the local MP was held on the 28th of February.

It was decided to run 2 sessions with different groups to reduce the waiting list. Mother helpers were rostered on for each session. A lot of the equipment was donated or handmade by parents. Fundraising was on-going.

On the 5th of December 1972 a committee meeting was held in the presence of Mr B Appleby and Mr G Hill (Justices of the Peace) to form the centre as an incorporated society. The existing organisation, known as the Kurow Pre-school Centre was dissolved.

Whan Lodge Trust Chairman's Report 2023

The priority for the Trust is to provide management and staff with the support, equipment and facilities needed to ensure that our residents receive the best possible care.

A major focus since 2018 has been the restructuring of the Awakino Wing and the renovation of the existing amenities. Once the consents were completed the contract was let out to Breens Construction. Long delays through covid and obtaining a satisfactory earthquake rating saw the cost of the project increase 30%. The Trust made the decision to proceed with the new bedrooms, kitchen, dining, laundry, sluice room and front entrance, enabled by the financial support from the Waitaki District Council and Otago Community Trust and grants from Meridian Energy, Network Waitaki, Mid and South Canterbury Trust and Waitaki Heritage plus our own fundraising efforts. One and a half million dollars will complete this section of the build. The redecorating, replacing the windows, doors and roofing will be covered with finance from Heritage Building. These grants are released in December. The forecast is completion of the rebuild by February. It has been a massive undertaking over the last four years and has taken a huge commitment from everyone. It's great to see the end in sight.

Alice Washington-Jones resigned in February – we wish Alice all the best. Susan Scott was appointed Facility Manager, Susie McCone - Nurse and Lu Sargent - Administration. We welcome them on board.

Our staff have continued to do an outstanding job throughout the year. Their commitment to do 12-hour shifts when we unfortunately got low on staff numbers was a great effort. Well done team. The excellent care that they provide for our residents is second to none and we thank them all. It's that care the reputation of Whalan Lodge hinges on.

After spending several weeks at the beginning of the financial year with ten residents, dropping to nine at one stage and coupled with delays in funding from M.O.H, it was a good result to get the books to break even. This would not have happened without donations and fundraising from the community. We look forward to getting more residents so that the business will become more sustainable.

I thank all the people who make monetary donations and all the volunteers who did so much to help with the auction and those who help with general work around the Lodge – especially those jobs that require machinery. It's a tremendous boost for our community owned asset.

Long standing member Alan Cleave recently retired from the Trust. Alan was one of the original members when Whalan Lodge was set up in 1984. He has been a past president. His wide knowledge of what happened in the past – what was successful and what wasn't proved to be of great value with some of our decision making. His retirement is well earned.

Alan's successor is Michael Smith who has worked closely with the Trust since organising the Auction. Welcome aboard Mike.

On behalf of all our Trust members I thank Gaye Schurgers who has retired for her accounting skills in looking after our finances. She has been a real asset and we wish her all the best.

To my fellow Trustees and secretary Judy Croft – you each have your own areas of expertise and spend many hours each week on Lodge matters. A great team.
